Fertility Study in Great Dane Dogs

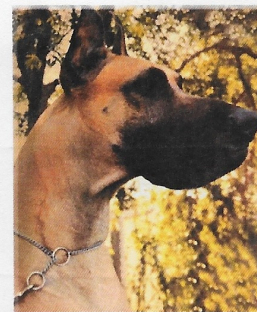
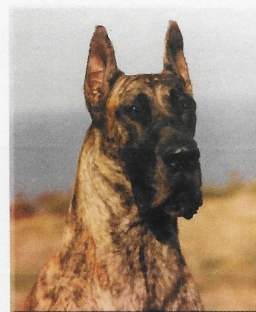
■ ■ Background

• Sperm motility and numbers are the only parameters we currently have to measure sperm. These parameters do not always have a strong correlation to infertility in many males. We have the ability to measure more detailed aspects of sperm, including cell membrane and DNA integrity, as well as sperm cell metabolism. Some of these parameters may correlate with infertility. The objective of this study is to identify fertility parameters in canine semen and develop new methods to assess stud dog fertility.



■ ■ Participation Requirements

* Great Dane males whose owners and/or breeders would voluntarily donate a few cc of the dog's semen to be used in this study.



■ ■ Procedures

• Manual collection of a fresh semen sample by a veterinarian in attendance at the National Specialty.

■ ■ Owner Responsibilities

• Complete a registration form online or at the National prior to collection.
• If you choose to have your own veterinarian do the collection, coordinate the visit to your veterinarian with Dr. Stuart Meyers at UC Davis so the appropriate shipping materials may be sent to your veterinarian.



■ ■ Benefits

• After the study is completed, owners will receive a complete report of their dog's semen test results.
• Results from this study may lead to the development of advanced diagnostic tests to determine causes of infertility in male dogs and may lead to preventative or curative recommendations for future cases and the development of new semen additives and new methods to cryopreserve dog semen.

Keeping the above words from our GDCC Mission Statement in mind, I propose the following be added to our Standing Rules:

1. Each member or applicant must include a requirement in their sales contract that any Great Dane puppy or adult Great Dane sold from their breeding/co-breeding must be returned to them if the owner no longer wishes or is unable to keep it. Failure to take responsibility for a first-generation Great Dane born in a member's home or co-bred by a member will result in an automatic inquiry by the GDCC Board, with the possibility of charges being filed.
2. Each member or applicant must microchip all the puppies or adult Great Danes sold and send in the paperwork to the appropriate AKC site. This assures that, in the event the new owners become irresponsible, the breeder will be notified and able to respond if the animal is lost or stolen.

I propose that this addition to the Standing Rules be part of our annual dues statement, requiring the signature of each member who is renewing their membership, whether or not the member is an active breeder. If the signature is not received, then the check is returned, and the membership is not renewed.

Each application for membership is to have this rule stated in it, requiring a signature that it has been read and accepted.

I am making this proposal due to the ever-increasing number of Great Danes in Rescue, a few of which have been bred by Club members or sired by dogs owned by Club members. We have discussed this in the past, and it seems that the proposal just died from apathy on our part. I don't think we can ignore the situation any longer.

Feedback on proposed standing rule to be reviewed by the Standing Rule Committee:

1 Feedback and recommendations of the proposed standing rule:

Paragraph 1a: Comments: It is clearly the responsibility of the Club to encourage its members to include the proposed requirement in all of their sales contracts. To require members to include this, or anything else, in their contracts (under threat of board inquiry for possible filing of charges) is beyond the scope of the Club and unenforceable. Enforcement must be global in nature. Selective enforcement is illegal and will result in the possibility of being sued. How will this be policed? Are all sales contracts a requirement that must be filed and reviewed by the club? Would this really stop someone from breeding a litter irresponsibly? Who keeps these records, reviews and passes judgment? Over time (i.e. years) how is this practice going to be communicated and policed?

Paragraph 1b: Comments – “Failure to take responsibility for a first-generation Great Dane.... will result in possible club charges”: A standing rule should withstand the test of time, i.e. 5-10 years and longer. How do you know the breeder has failed in their responsibility? Who investigates the reason and situation behind it? Who makes the moral call on this and how do you find out about the problem in the beginning through an unbiased and structured source? Do we have club members reporting other club members, so that the club can dole out charges? If this was enforceable, AKC and GDCA would already be doing this. Instead of focusing on forcing/requiring people to do things and doling out punishment, why not look to the positive encouragement of proper behavior in front of our members at all time. If there are club members who are not being responsible breeders, then let them be reported with appropriate documentation to the board but standing rules should not in themselves be threatening.

Additionally, we don't want the club to be put in a position of having to address charges against an individual based on personal grievances from a fellow member.

Paragraph 2: Comments: Who is going to police (and how) that all puppies and adults are microchipped that are sold? How is the club going to be aware of all the litters / dogs that are born in their nearly 90-some membership? Again, we should focus on how to encourage members to act responsibly, i.e. (just a suggestion) having the Club provide free convenient microchipping to members, give away pens at the specialties with an imprinted slogan “Microchip EVERY Puppy”. We should be serious enough about this to spend a few dollars to promote this and back up our club policies.

Last paragraph: Comments: Instead of threatening to reduce membership by a lack of a signature, why not add a sentence to the dues statements something to the effect that renewing a membership signifies acceptance of the Club's Mission Statement and policies concerning responsible breeding and microchipping. It has the same effect but is much less objectionable.

The club should “protect” the breed and itself from any breeding related indiscretions of its members. If we find that someone applies for membership who violates these policies (and it can be proved – not just one person's opinions), we should not vote them into the club in the first place. If there are already members, cleaning up after them is harder and should be investigated with proper documentation on file on a one-by-one basis in a discreet manner.

Feedback on proposed standing rule to be reviewed by the Standing Rule Committee:

#2 Feedback and recommendations of the proposed standing rule:

Dear Fellow Club Members –

I would like to commend the club for taking an active role in the wellbeing of our beloved breed. In response to the new proposed standing rules that had been purposed and discussed at the May club meeting I would like to express the concerns that I have with the proposed wording of rule number 1.

Each member or applicant must include a requirement in their sales contract that any Great Dane puppy or adult Great Dane sold from their breeding/co-breeding must be returned to them if the owner no longer wishes or is unable to keep it. Failure to take responsibility for a first-generation Great Dane born in a member's home or co-bred by a member will result in an automatic inquiry by the GDCC Board, with the possibility of charges being filed.

The wording I have concerns with is: must be returned to them

This to me has no flexibility. I feel the owner/breeder should be given the opportunity to work together to find a suitable new home for the dog/puppy or the said dog/puppy is to be returned to the breeder. I feel that every situation is a case by case situation and there are times where returning the puppy/dog is not feasible and to mandate only 1 option is not realistic. I feel better wording is needed to allow for other suitable options.

#3 Feedback and recommendations of the proposed standing rule:

Dane Rescue Crisis

Due to the ever-increasing number of Great Danes turned over to a number of rescue shelters throughout our state, the Great Dane Club of California is compelled to address this issue!

First the club **recommends** that every member include a requirement in their sales contract that any Great Dane puppy sold from their breeding/ co-breeding must be returned to them if the owner no longer wishes or is unable to keep it.

Secondly the club recommends that every member be thoroughly familiar with the Great Dane Club of America's Code of Ethics and the Breeders Code of Ethics.

Thirdly the club recommends all members make a committed effort to support their local Rescue shelters, (Money or supplies). This problem deserves our utmost attention and as responsible members and breeders we should make every effort to Educate and mentor fellow Dane owners and breeders.

Our ultimate goal is to ensure that our Danes are loved and protected!

Feedback on proposed standing rule to be reviewed by the Standing Rule Committee:

#4 Feedback and recommendations of the proposed standing rule:

Ever since I have owned Danes, from 1970 to now all the purchases I have made had verbiage similar to this:

If at any time the buyer cannot maintain ownership of said dog, the buyer agrees not to transfer ownership or rehome the dog without first notifying the breeder. Once notified, breeder is more than willing to take the dog back, without a refund for the best interest of the dog or assist with finding a new placement for the dog.

The standing rule up for vote in my opinion is just bringing the information back to the forefront of any club member owners responsibilities as stated in the purpose for "Standing Rules" shall govern the management & Procedures of the GDCC in support of the Club Bylaws.

#5 Feedback and recommendations of the proposed standing rule:

Add to the GDCC Standing Rules:

All members shall comply with the GDCA Breeder Code of Ethics.

It is strongly recommended that breeders themselves register any dog sold as pet with limited registration to assure it is done.

It is strongly recommended that breeders microchip any dogs sold and list breeder as the primary. Since the membership application #5 states "Will you comply with and uphold the Constitution, By-Laws, and Standing Rules of The Club?" our club can expect members to follow the GDCA Breeder Code of Ethics.

(This is in the GDCA Breeder Code of Ethics regarding limited registration)

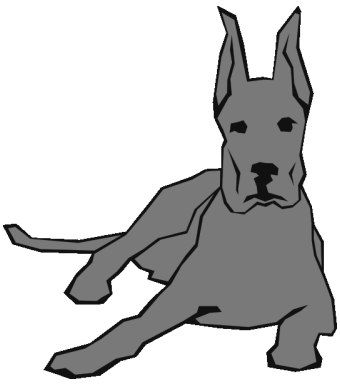
Provide a four or more generation color marked pedigree and the AKC registration at the time of sale of each dog. Any dog sold as a pet and not for breeding should be given a limited registration or a written contract specifying conditions of sale (e.g. spay/neuter agreement, show or pet quality, co-ownership, breeding rights, etc.).

I suggest discussions in meetings on issues such as microchipping with AKC reunite and the benefits as well as the overwhelming number of purebred Great Danes in rescue from owner's surrender and dumped in shelters as well as BYB producing puppies w/ AKC numbers. To bring attention to the problem we are facing with unethical breeding practices and avoid our club having to enforce ethical breeding practices by members of our club.

Thank you for taking the time to address these concerning issues.

Big Dog Corner



FIRST AID FOR MINOR PAW CUTS AND PAD SCRAPES

Our dog's pads are protective cushions and soles much like shoes are for our feet. Paw pads are tough, but can be scraped by tough terrain, hot surfaces, and cut by sharp objects. Here is a quickie first aid guideline:

1. CLEANING

Soak pad in Epson Salt for 5-10 minutes.
(1/2 cup Epson salt to 1 gallon warm water)

2. EVALUATING

Check paw for any debris, remove particles if you can and if the dog allows. If bleeding, apply an ice pack to constrict the blood vessels, wrap with vet wrap, allowing for 2 fingers to slip under wrap. Consult with a veterinarian.

3. BANDAGE

Assuming no bleeding apply a nonstick telfa pad smeared with medical grade Manuka honey directly over area of pad involved. Secure with paper tape, wrap the dog's whole foot with gauze. Then use vet wrap, again 2 finger rule with the vet wrap, bandaging all the way up to include the next joint.

KEEP BANDAGE DRY! Duct tape or a plastic bag works when dog goes outside. I like to change my bandages DAILY or smell the bandage daily. If no odor, change bandage every 2-3 days NO LONGER!

4. HEALING

Pads are very tender and slow to heal. Manuka Honey is an amazing healer. Constrict exercise and licking of wound after bandage comes off. Read your dog, he/she will tell you when the pad is healed.

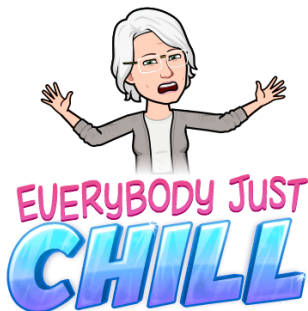
